



St. John the Baptist Return to School Blueprint

The purpose of this blueprint is to provide a basis for how StJB will respond to the Covid-19 pandemic and its impact on our academic program during the 2020-2021 school year. This framework is set up in tiers in order to allow our school to be responsive to changing health related circumstances. The existence of a formal plan will be there to supply families and staff with a clear, comprehensive, and transparent vision of the upcoming school year.

Updates and notification of positive cases within our school will be communicated through our School messenger system and email. Please make sure the school has your most current phone numbers and email for effective communication.

St. John is blessed to have large classroom sizes and relatively small class numbers. This allows us to be able to be more flexible when moving from yellow to orange based on the Sarpy/Cass Health department dial. The dial is one tool to help us determine the educational plan for our building. With the use of the dial, guidance from the health department, Diocese of Lincoln, Nebraska Department of Education and the Governor we will make the best decision for St. John the Baptist school to provide a safe, supportive, and faith based learning environment.
